I would like to give some latest news from Camp Tishomingo. We Spend Sunday evening and Monday at camp this week to get some of the latest work inspected by the building department for Apache County.

Attached is a copy of the Certificate of Occupancy for the Maintenance Building which was issued on 4/12/2011. We had the Multi Propose building inspected this time for framing and rough in electrical. It gives me great pleasure to say that we passed both these inspections with no red tags from the inspector and have been given the go ahead to start installing sheetrock in any place in the building that has not got plumbing.

This has been the answer of many prayers and hard work from people that are helping God with his goals to have a church camp at Camp Tishomingo. We need to keep in mind that this is not the final chapter. This is a process that we are working on to have a fully operational Camp that we can Hundreds of people come to Know, Believe, and Live for Christ. This is only possible if everyone grabs the rope and pulls your fair share!

We now need to complete the rough in plumbing and the heater ducts. We have two options we get volunteers to come up to camp and help or we hire professionals to complete the task. If we get the volunteers we can continue to work on this and make great gains to get this Camp ready for summer of 2012. With the option to pay for people to complete the task we will need to have financial support from more people.

I had a discussion with the Building Inspector Supervisor (Bob Martin) and asked if we got the Restrooms and Kitchen completed would we be able to get a temporary permit to have camp in 2012? An his answer was certainly. Bob said that he is also looking to the day that there will be kids and people in this property for the purpose that it is here to be used for.

Last of all we have some issues at camp that we need prayers for as our generator has decided not to work. We had some mice get into the generator and have shorted out something in the system. We are having it inspected and they are giving us a cost to repair the generator. We are just praying that the cost is not very expensive.

We just need to keep laying this burden of Camp Tishomingo at Gods feet. For those that look at where we have been must start looking at the future and where this can be if we stay focused on the goal. This has been a great ministry for the AARBC and will continue to grow but you need to keep in mind you set the pace! It is your time and your dollars that will keep this on track and complete this ministry and then we will see the fruits of our labors.
